From the 401

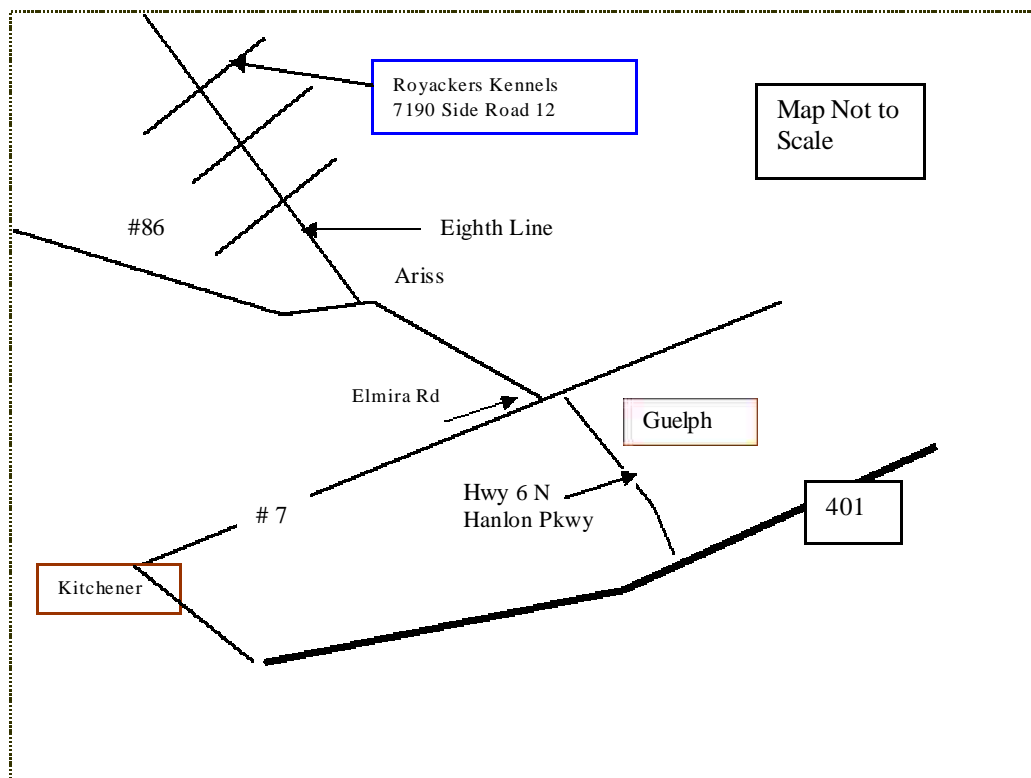
#401 to #6 north, through Guelph. Turn left onto #7 (Woodlawn Rd.)

At the lights at the car dealerships, turn right onto Regional Rd. #86 (Elmira Road)

Go through 2 sets of lights in the country. Next road turn right onto 8th Line. At the 3rd road turn right onto Sideroad 12 - we are 1st place on the left (yellow barns). Drive in the driveway, go past the house & yellow barns, follow driveway to parking lot and agility field.

From Fergus:

#6 towards Guelph. Take 1st right onto the 2nd Line (Grand River Stone). Go to the end and turn left onto Wellington Rd. #7 (Elora Rd.). Take the first road right (Sideroad 10). Take the 3rd road left (6th Line). Take the 1st road right (Sideroad 12). We are the 1st place on the right. Pull in the driveway, go past the house and yellow barns, follow driveway around to parking lot and agility field.

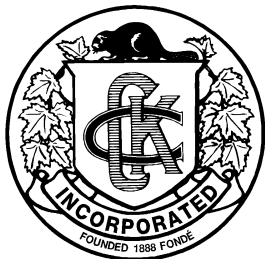

General Information	<p>The Trial Secretary and Superintendent is in full charge of the Trials. The show precincts shall consist of 30 feet around the ring area. Food and toys are not permitted in the course area and handlers are not permitted to use whistles, clickers, flexis or other instruments or devices in the ring or within 10 feet of the course. Bitches in Season are also NOT permitted within 300 feet of ring area. Dogs <u>must</u> be ON LEASH at all times when outside the ring.</p>
Event Information	<p>Ring Surface is grass. Entire ring is fenced in with gates. Handlers in all classes will be able to walk their course, without their dog prior to the start of the class. ELECTRONIC TIMING will be used at these trials. Handlers must be ready at the start line when called or risk forfeiting their run. If a dog is not at ringside after it has been called 3 times, it will be marked absent. Obstacle familiarization will be available for Novice classes immediately prior to the first Novice Standard class of EACH day.</p>
Obstacles	<p>Obstacles shall meet the specifications in the CKC Agility Rules and Regulations effective January 1, 2010. Please note, there are several changes and exhibitors are advised to read the new rulebook to become aware of them.</p>
Eligibility	<p>To be eligible to compete in these trials, a dog must be 18 mos. of age and registered or be eligible for registration with the CKC, have an ERN or CKC Miscellaneous Certificate or Performance Event Number (PEN) Spayed bitches, debarked dogs, and neutered males are eligible to participate.</p>
Bitches in Season	<p>Bitches in season may not compete. When a bitch comes into season after the entry has closed a Veterinarian's certificate, certifying the bitch was in season within the 10-day period preceding the trial must reach the secretary on or before the start of the trial. A full refund of entry fees and listing fees will be given.</p>
Ribbons	<p>Ribbons will be given for qualifying scores in all Jump Heights.</p>
Food Concession	<p>Closest restaurants: in Elora (15 minutes) Subway, Tim Hortons, New Orleans Pizza, in Guelph (15 minutes) A&W, Tim Hortons, Harveys, Wendys.</p>

The owner or handler of the dog must sign the Liability Agreement on the back of the entry form. Incomplete entries will be returned.

Entries will only be accepted if accompanied by correct fees.

Courier entries will be accepted if no signature is required.

Move-ups will be allowed after the closing date. For Trial 1 move-ups must be received by the trial secretary no later than 72 hours prior to the trial. For all other trials move-ups must be received 1 hour prior to the trial you wish to move up in.

Alterations, substitutions or cancellations of any entry after the closing date, is prohibited, except as noted in this premium list. **The only exception is bitches in season. Unfortunately, we can not refund any entries for injured dogs after the closing.**

Exhibitors must abide by errors made in entering their dogs regardless of how or by whom the entries were made.

Foreign Exhibitors

Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, in US funds. Please do not mark personal cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated.

Are you entering the correct Class?

Selected Class: Any dog eligible to enter an agility trial may enter the Selected Class but can not be entered in the Selected Class and Regular Class at the same set of trials.

Dogs entering the Selected Class must progress through the various levels beginning with the Novice level. When entering this class your dog will jump one jump height lower than its Regular jump height and this class will get 10% more time than the Regular Standard course time. For full rules on the Selected Class please refer to the Official CKC Agility rule book.

Novice A is for persons and dogs that have never acquired an agility title in any country or with any organization.

Novice B is for agility instructors and judges, and for dogs that have acquired the Novice title, but have not earned a qualifying score in Agility Intermediate; and for persons who have previously exhibited a dog to an agility title in any agility organization.

Excellent A is for dogs that have acquired the Intermediate title, but have not yet earned the Agility Excellent title in either Standard or JWW. (You need three qualifying scores in the Ex A class before entering Ex B.)

Excellent B is for dogs that have acquired the Excellent title or the Master Excellent Title. A dog may move up into Excellent B in only the Standard or JWW class that they have earned an Excellent Title in.

Veteran Classes (effective January 1, 2010):

8.5.1 At the option of the handler, a dog 7 years of age or older may be entered in the Veterans Class. Once a dog has been designated as a Veteran and entered in this class, the dog cannot revert/transfer back to the Regular or Selected Classes. The dog will retain titles and/or Qualifying scores towards titles accumulated. Any new titles earned will be designated with the letter 'V' for Veteran following the title (e.g. AGMXV).

8.5.2 All veterans will compete as if running in the Selected Classes at one or two jump heights lower than regular and with the 10% additional time allocated for the Selected Class.

8.5.3 Veterans Classes run the same courses as the Regular and Selected Classes and dogs entered in these classes run concurrently in the respective jump heights.
